

Youth crime has fallen over the last 10 years but there has been a recent increase in a small number of crime types in some areas – mostly Auckland







Police examined 5,955 proceedings from February to July 2022, focussing on offences linked to ram-raiding, and identified 79 of the most serious offenders.


Police found ALL of these individuals:

- Come from unstable, impoverished households with inconsistent role models, and low parental guardianship
- Have poor or non-existent engagement with education
- Are either the victims of or witnesses to family harm
- Have fathers who are engaged with the criminal justice system, either as frequent offenders or with periods of imprisonment
- Live in social circles where offending is normalised.
- They began offending between 12 and 14 years of age.

This is consistent with previous research, which shows that young offenders have highest needs and these factors are cumulative, including:
