


The Data Exchange enables faster, secure transfer of information in near real-time, supporting better decision making.

Te Tihi o Ruahine leads the Kāinga Whānau Ora pilot – a collective impact initiative focused on whānau living in Housing New Zealand (HNZ) homes in Palmerston North. Its purpose is to build self-reliance by supporting whānau towards achieving their goals and aspirations, by focusing on improving housing, supporting children, boosting skills and employment, reducing reliance on benefits, and improving health by using data to inform decision making for whānau and partners.

Kāinga Whānau Ora's goals are:

1. All whānau live in structurally safe, warm dry homes within flourishing communities in Palmerston North.
2. Provide pathways to education and training and employment opportunities, and increase knowledge and skills to enable people to make better decisions.
3. Live in safe and loving relationships free of violence.
4. System, procedural and policy changes.



Who benefits:

Agencies and NGOs provide data via the Data Exchange, which is collated and displayed on a number of Dashboards.

The Dashboards include versions for whānau and providers.

Whānau are supported by Navigators, who support the aspirations of whānau to become self-managing and take responsibility for their health, economic, cultural and social development and wellbeing.
